

### About The Championships

Ballooning competitions are not a race; the competition flights (consisting of one or more tasks) require pilots to exercise skill in manoeuvring their balloons over a set course with goals, targets, scoring areas, time and distance limits.

Good results are achieved using the variation of winds at different altitudes to fly in the direction of a goal and accurately approach the target. Balloons do not land on the target. Pilots of the balloons drop markers (small sandbags with streamers attached) onto or as close to the target as they can fly. In addition, each balloon carries an electronic GPS logger which records the position & altitude of the balloon at all times. If no marker is dropped the logger can be used to determine how close the balloon was to the target. Points are awarded for each task, and the balloon with the highest aggregate score wins.

Please do not touch or move the markers, as this may adversely affect the score and results of the pilots.

### Some of the tasks are

**Judge Declared Goal:** The Event Director declares a goal and a measuring team will place a target at this position. The balloons launch from a common launch site and fly to the goal to drop a marker closest to the target.

**Pilot Declared Goal:** The pilots declare their own individual goals, usually road intersections, before take-off.

**Fly In:** The pilot selects a launch site at a set minimum distance away from a target nominated by the Director.

This is often combined with a Fly On task: The pilot selects a goal during flight a set minimum and maximum distance from where they drop their previous marker.

**Hare & Hounds:** A 'hare' balloon will launch from a common launch site, and after a specified period of time, all the other balloons will launch and set off in pursuit. When the 'hare' lands, the pilot of the 'hare' will set out a target and the other balloons will try to fly over the top and drop a marker on the target.

**Watership Down:** The 'hare' balloon will launch at a declared time and location. The others will launch at a location of their choosing, at a specified minimum distance from the 'hare', and try to follow the 'hare', who will again set out a target after landing.

**Hesitation Waltz:** The pilots must reach one of a number of alternative goals set by the Director. They will usually choose a preferred goal, and if conditions change, they can select an alternative. The success at one goal is scored.

**3D Task:** A task may be set in which the pilot must fly to a set position or area in the air, this goal may be several hundred feet above ground. The pilot must fly to this point or area, registering their position on a GPS 'logger'.

**The Key Grab:** A highly skilled challenge that requires pilots to literally grab a foam key mounted on top of a 10m pole. The key represents the key to a prize. Pilots select a take off point that will allow them to fly over the Northam Airfield, where the prize pole will be located. This fly-in task provides a magnificent spectator event.

### Steering a Balloon

There is no mechanism to steer a balloon. The pilots have control of altitude by climbing & descending and will use the wind directions at different altitudes to manoeuvre the balloon. By skilfully moving up and down into these different wind directions, the pilot can catch a wind travelling in the desired direction. A small helium-filled balloon is released before take-off and the pilot monitors the wind directions as it rises.

Balloons take time to react to increases in heat (to rise) or releases of hot air (to descend) so the skill is to judge how long to travel at a certain height, how much heat to add or lose, and how long it will take to get the reaction needed.

### When to see the Balloons

The team at Northam Ballooning Events Inc., along with the Northam Aero Club and the Shire of Northam, are delighted to once again WELCOME members of the public from locations across WA, who are here to experience the visual spectacle of the massed balloons taking to the air in a colourful and breathtaking display.

Practice flights will take place, weather permitting, at sunrise on **Saturday 6th & Sunday 7th May.** 

The competition flights will take place, weather permitting, each morning and afternoon from **Monday 8th to Friday 12th May**. At sunrise on **Saturday 13th May** there will be either an additional competition flight, or the exciting 'key grab' fly-in (see page 7 for competition task information).

### Weather & Cancellation

The protected Avon Valley offers the best conditions for ballooning in Western Australia, however balloon flights are always weather dependent; wind speeds in excess of about 10 km/hr on the ground may result in cancellation for safety reasons. Optimum conditions are usually found in the morning, after the cold nights keep the wind conditions still, in the valley.

### Where can I see the Balloons?

The balloons do not always launch from the airfield, depending on the wind conditions they may launch from other locations. **You can check our**  **facebook page** for up-dated daily launch detail, which will be posted after the Pilot Briefing each morning, at approx 6 a.m. and after the Pilot Briefing each afternoon at approx 4.00 p.m. We also recommend that you approach our friendly team of volunteers at the Airfield who will be able recommend how best to view the balloons, but please DO NOT FOLLOW the balloons onto PRIVATE PROPERTY.

### Following the Balloons

We need to remind all our visiting spectator vehicles to follow the ROAD RULES of Western Australia, be courteous to other drivers on the road by not holding up traffic whilst looking at balloons, and not blocking any roads or driveways by parking inappropriately.

The balloons will often land on private farming property. Please **DO NOT FOLLOW** any ground crews onto **PRIVATE PROPERTY** or on to any sports ovals or grassed public areas.

### **Balloon Protocol**

If the balloons do launch at the airfield, we ask that you follow a few directions:

- Please do not walk on the balloon fabric
- Please stay behind any safety ropes or barriers, and keep well clear of the balloon inflation fans
- Please keep your children near to YOU at all times
- Please follow the safety instructions of the balloon crew and local volunteer crew



Sean is a designer and production manager at Kavanagh balloons in Sydney, Australia. He has regularly competed all over the world since 1995 and is the current Australian National Hot Air Ballooning Champion having also won the title back in 2003. Sean has represented Australia at seven World Championships, with a best result of 15th. In 2008 he also set the Australian Altitude record of 37,838 ft in a hot air balloon. When not flying, he can be found kite surfing and enjoying time with his family.



Paterson Saunders VIC VH YHO 'Melbourne' Kavanagh EX 90

Since attaining his pilot's license as a teenager, Pato Saunders has chased ballooning through many parts of Australia and the world, including jobs and projects in Europe, the Middle East, and South America. He has represented Australia in numerous competitions, including the Junior World Hot Air Ballooning Championships in 2019. Today, Pato flies commercially over Melbourne and the Yarra Valley, and takes pride in instructing the next generation of Australian ballooning pilots.

He commenced flying as a pilot in 2002, and his best competition result to date is 5th place and rookie of the year at 2007 Nationals. Scobie is flying his homebuilt experimental balloon 'UP' at this event.



Benjamin Phillips VIC VH-XYT 'Thambula' Lovingly built by WA Pilot, Donna

Ben has been flying balloons since 2019, and this will be his first Australian Championships as a pilot. It's not his first National Championships however, because he competed in the 2019 Czech Nationals. Outside of ballooning Ben lives on a small farm on the edge of Melbourne with his family, attempting to grow most of the family's food and breeding chickens that lay unusual coloured eggs. For work, he helps authors turn their words into published books, with a focus on business and thought leader books.



#### Andrew Robertson NSW VH WUW 'Balloony McBalloonface' Kavanagh EX60

Andrew (Robbo) started ballooning in the late 1970s at age four. He obtained his private pilot license in 1994 and his instructor and commercial ratings in 1996. Andrew has competed at all Australian National Championships since 1996 (except 2001). He has represented Australia at World Championships in 2006, 2012, 2018 and 2022. Andrew is supported by his super "Team Robbo" consisting of wife Kath and son James. When he is not flying balloons, he is also a keen expedition kayaker, videographer and photographer.



Edward Saunders VIC VH ZUW 'Zoncello' Kavanagh EX 70

Edward grew up around balloons and has been flying them since age 15. With a passion for aviation and an adventurous family he has flown in a variety of extraordinary locations. He works full time as a commercial balloon pilot in Melbourne with his father and two siblings in the family business. He has competed at ballooning competitions around Australia and the world, and placed 12th in the recent World Championships in Slovenia. He will be flying the newest member of the Zonzo fleet, the yellow Zoncello balloon. So Look out for the flying lemon




#### Scarlett Saunders VIC VH ZOW 'Zonzo' Kavanagh EX 60

Scarlett comes from an aviation family and started flying balloons at the age of 15, after being dragged around Australia and the world on her father's ballooning exploits. She holds a commercial balloon pilots licence and flies commercially in Victoria. She has flown her balloon near and far, including flights over the Snowy Mountains, the Warrumbungles and the Gulf of Carpentaria, and a womens Australian record flight to 23,700 ft over Deniliguen NSW. This is Scarlett's first Nationals. So look out for some fun from the little blue ZONZO racer dancing around the sky.




Mathew Scaife NSW VH-855 'Sea Shepherd' Kubicek 60

Matthew is a triple Australian Ballooning Champion, winning the Championships in 2014, 2015 and 2017; as well as 2016 Japanese Grand Prix teams event Champion. He regularly competes in events throughout the world, representing Australia on a number of occasions. He is currently 11th in the FAI World pilot rankings.



Nicola Scaife NSW VH-NKS 'Flow' Kavanagh EX 60

Nicola has been ballooning for 17 years. She started as a retrieve crew and gained her PPL a year later. She flies as a commercial balloon pilot in the Hunter Valley, NSW. Her best achievements so far include winning the Women's World Championship twice in 2014 & 2016, and placing third in 2018. She also placed 9th in the open World Championship in 2018. She is currently ranked 17th on the FAI world ranking and is the highest ranked female pilot. Nicola loves the challenge of competition flying and the community that comes together from all walks of life to enjoy this unique passion.



Jared Shore ACT VH LFS Kavanagh D 84

Jared and his team have travelled from Canberra ACT, Batemans Bay NSW, Forster NSW and Sydney NSW. This is his 4th time participating at a Nationals event, and 2nd time as pilot in command. Jared says that it's always a great experience ballooning here in the incredible and welcoming town of Northam.



#### Les Springett NSW VH OTS 'Hot Stuff' Kavanagh EX 77

Les has been a balloonist since 1979, and a pilot since 1991. He is a keen competing pilot and has represented Australia overseas at the highest level, including a World championship. Les has attended all Australian National Ballooning Championships since 1981. In Northam Les has attended previously as crew, an official, and since 1992 as a competitor.


Geoff Howe ACT VH IGH 'Poppy' Ultramagic 42

## Northam Airfield

### **Built by the Community for the Community**

The 1960's were halcyon days for flying. The Royal Aero Club was expanding and moving from Perth Guildford Airport to Jandakot, interest in flying had spread to rural areas, with Flying Schools at Bunbury & Narrogin, and aerial agriculture was becoming a huge business with large tonnages of fertilizer being spread from the air, this being the only way in many cases with such wet seasons.



At Northam, in 1968, a group of enthusiastic locals headed by Keith Nicholson, and including Bruce Smart, Geoff Way & Adrian Clements, formed a steering committee to find land for an airstrip and flying school. After much ground work, an interim site was identified at Noggojerring on the farming property of Des & Max Smith, who generously leased their paddock, while the search for a permanent site continued. Working bees ensured that a strip was mown, suitable markers placed, windsock installed, large trees removed; and a briefing room, fuel shed and toilet constructed. That original old briefing hut can still be found, adjacent to the current Club Rooms.

The first instructor was David Walker, on Ioan from Narrogin Flying Club, followed soon after by John Douglas AM, now Chief Flying Instructor at Royal Aero Club of WA. In the first few months of that first year, 20 members took out student licences, 8 went solo, 2 were granted RPPL's, and 150 training hours were flown. Meantime, a permanent site was found, and the property where the Airfield is now located was purchased from Mr Lyall Hurley in 1970 jointly by the then Town & Shire Councils, to be leased back to the Aero Club to foster aviation activities for the benefit of the town and district.

The present club rooms were once the drum stand and offices of the Caltex Depot in Northam (now the Boulevard shopping arcade parking area). Sam Oliver (later club president) was awarded the contract for demolition of the site and recognizing its potential, coordinated the removal and rebuilding at the Airfield. Richard Page made available the enormous windows from his Ford dealership depot, and John Dietrich supplied the suspending ceilings. The Club was fortunate in its membership - plumbers, electricians, builders & building Inspectors being amongst its number; so the building of brick toilets, making of septic, electric & water connections were all done by members. The last major project to be undertaken was the installation of runway lights; one of the most satisfying, for its life saving use by RFDS & Aerial Ambulance in Emergency - a far cry from filling beer cans with sand & avgas to light the strip!

From its humble beginnings, the Northam Airfield has evolved into a busy regional centre for aviation. The Aero Club continues to have an enthusiastic & active membership, hosting monthly flying competitions & social events, and operating a busy flying school with its own aircraft, and three instructors. The Club now acts as manager of the airfield for the Northam Shire Council, ensuring that facilities are safely maintained for the ever-increasing number of private hangars, as well as substantial businesses that are based here. Northam Air Services is one of the state's most well-respected aircraft engineering companies, servicing aircraft from the wheat-belt & wider rural regions, from Perth metro, and with a regular 'mobile-mechanic' schedule, flying to remote outback customers.

The Airfield is also home to Windward Balloon Adventures, one of Western Australia's premier, and award winning, tourism operators. Also one of Australia's oldest ballooning companies, Windward celebrated 40 years of operations at Northam in 2022, this picturesque part of the Avon Valley providing the ideal conditions to experience the unique joys of hot-air ballooning.

The Airfield and the Aero Club have come a long way from a tiny tin shed at the old Airstrip, but one thing remains a constant, and that is an ongoing commitment to, and active participation in, the community of Northam.

## Northam

### Heart of the Avon Valley and home to ballooning in Western Australia

Balloons were first seen in Northam in the early 1970's, when a group of pilots from Hong Kong came to Western Australia. They were looking for a location away from the controlled airspace over Perth, with plenty of open spaces for ballooning - the small island of Hong Kong not being ideal! In the Avon Valley they discovered a keen group of enthusiasts at the Northam Aero Club willing to assist. As flight crew with Cathay Pacific, their regular route to Perth allowed them to ship balloons to Northam, and a day or two off so they could do some ballooning.

The group of enthusiasts at the Northam Aero Club were in turn instructed in the skills of flying balloons, with a number of locals attaining their British Balloon Pilot Licences – and so being amongst the first balloonists in Australia to gain recognised qualifications, as there was as yet no Australian licensing system.

Northam skies are still to be seen adorned with colourful balloons, with regular flights by both Windward Balloon Adventures, and the enthusiastic members of the WA Balloon & Airship Club.

The Australian Balloon Championships have been held in Northam on four previous occasions, in 1981, 1984, 2015 & 2017. The logistical difficulties of transporting 20-30 balloons & baskets, equipment, pilots, crew and qualified Officials have seen the Championships held on mostly on the east coast - but the enormous success of the 2015 & 2017 Championships in Northam resulted in a chorus of pleas from pilots, crews, sponsors and townsfolk alike, for the event to be held here once again.

We extend a hearty welcome to our visiting teams of pilots & crew from interstate & overseas, and also to the many of you who will be visiting our town to enjoy the opportunity of witnessing the colour of the massed balloons, and to admire the endeavours of some of Australia's most skilled Balloon Pilots.

### Northam Honours its Record Setters

Northam's sheltered location in the Avon Valley, within easy reach of Perth, has seen the town become the home of ballooning in Western Australia. The upper jet stream flowing from west to east across the Australian continent has also made Northam the ideal starting point for numerous National and World ballooning record attempts, by locals and by high profile overseas balloonists. Each and every attempt has had the extensive involvement of local pilots, balloon crew and many other volunteers; assisting with planning, logistics, equipment flight preparation, balloon launch and retrieve operations.

### **Bernard Park Plinth**

In 2018 The Shire of Northam commissioned a plinth mounted with a plaque commemorating the achievements of local and international balloonists, all of which involved the people of Northam.

The plinth can be found in the beautiful surrounds of Bernard Park, on the town side of the Avon River.

### **Geoff Green**

- Hong Kong/British

Geoff introduced ballooning to Northam in the 1970's, having decided that this was the ideal location on the ideal continent, to be the take off point for his record attempts. Geoff's two records of note were the World AX6 Altitude Record, 30,500 ft in 'Charlie' in 1977; and in 1980, along with local Northam pilot **Adrian Clements**, Outright World Distance Record, 690 kms from Northam to Zanthus, east of Kalgoorlie on the trans-Australian railway, in the 'Sultan III' balloon.

In 1978 Sabu set Japanese altitude & distance records fly from the Northam Race Club to Shackleton.

#### **Ron Taaffe**

- Hong Kong/Australian

Ron set a number of Australian ballooning records from Northam, his most notable achievement in 1982, when he set the World Altitude, Distance and Duration Records in the San Miguel D-38 hot-air airship.

### **Paul Gianniotis**

#### - Hong Kong/Australian

Paul set an Australian duration record in 1980, and in the same year also set the World AX4 Distance Record of 154.68 kms.

#### Gren Putland - Northam, Western Australian

Australian altitude record 1980, Northam to Green Hills



### Geoff Tetlow - Northam, Western Australian

Australian distance record 1982, Northam to Pumpkin Hollow (Jurien Bay)

### Michio Kanda & Chikatsu Kakinuma - Japan

Base and operations centre were in Northam with a large crew of locals assembled to assist, including then Aero Club President Claude Meunier and his Aerostar for aerial tracking. In 1994 Michio and Chikatsu flew 'Mambo' 2366 kilometres, Mullewa to Broken Hill, setting a new AX10-14 World Distance Record.

### Kei-ichi Kojima - Japan

In 1995 Northam locals were recruited to help Kei launch from Dalwallinu, flying his small balloon over Beacon and Wialki, on towards Lake Baladjie; a new World AX5 Duration Record of 9hrs 17min.



### Maco Oiwa & Sabu Ichiyoshi

#### - Japan

In 1995 Northam teams mobilised, and the now-famous 'Mambo' balloon took off from Southern Cross. After a flight of 41 hours 29 minutes, Maco & Sabu landed at Coolardy Station, with a new World AX10-14 Duration Record.

In 1997 the Operations contingent & Northam base were again mobilised. Maco flew solo through the night in 'Wombat' from Southern Cross, landing 15 hours 22 minutes later near Mt Hampton; setting a World AX6 Duration Record.

#### Toshiko Ichiyoshi - Japan

In 1997 Maco's wife Tonko launched from Merredin in 'Wombat', flew solo through the night and landed west of Tampu the next morning; a feminine World AX6 Duration Record, 12 hours 15 minutes.



### Steve Fossett - USA

Steve Fossett was probably the most well-recognised Aviator to select Northam as a base. Organisation and logistics descended upon Northam on the grandest of scales, with a team of balloon and technical experts from the USA to get his massive 653,216 cu ft Cameron R-550 Roziere balloon airborne. Mission control was located at Washington University in St Louis.

In 2001 Steve had made a very windy failed inflation at Kalgoorlie, and after repairs in Northam & England, relocated to Northam. Hangar, facilities and logistics were at Northam Airfield, and dozens of local crew were recruited from the Aero Club, balloonists, SES, and local businesses.

The successful Solo Round the World flight was launched at Northam on 19 June 2002. Steve lifted off in 'Spirit of Freedom' at 1.37 pm, tracking across Australia, the Pacific Ocean, South America, the South Atlantic Ocean, below southern Africa, across the Indian Ocean, and across Australia again to make landing at Eromanga, QLD on 3 July 2002. Steve Fossett had achieved three world records:

Distance:32,957.44 km, Duration:355 hrs 57 min & Shortest Time Around the World.

#### Fedor Konyukhov - Russia

Fedor had already achieved many notable feats including: First solo sailboat circumnavigation of Antarctica, crossing the Atlantic Ocean, and the Pacific Ocean, in a row-boat, competing in the Iditarod dog race, dogsled expeditions from North Pole to Canada, and across the Greenland Ice Cap, and the first Russian Mountaineer to complete the 7 Summits Challenge.

In 2016 decided to emulate the flight of Steve Fossett, dedicating his flight to Steve. John Wallington from Canberra (the Safety Officer at these Championships) was engaged to assist in the Northam Flight Ops Centre; and the Northam Team was activated again. Hangar facilities, accommodation, and ground crew were soon in place. Fedor took off from the Northam Airfield on 12 July 2016. He flew solo around the world for 11 days 4 hours & 20 mins, before landing back almost exactly where he started.

In a "billion-to-one chance" quirk of meteorology, after travelling 33,521.4 km around the Earth, Fedor literally flew over his original take-off field, before landing safely near Bonnie Rock a few hours later. A new record for 'Shortest Time Around the World' and World Record for Distance travelled had been set.
